Reporting Children's Absence

If your child is going to be absent from school for sickness or any other reason that has not been prearranged or authorized, please make sure that you call the school office (after 8am when the phone lines open) and leave a message providing the reason for absence. You do need to call on every day that your child is absent from school.

Our attendance system sends an automated message at 9.45am to the parents of any child for whom the office staff have not logged a reason for absence. On days with high absence figures it is possible that the message is sent before all of the messages have been listened to and reasons logged. If you receive this message and have already reported your child's absence you do not need to respond.





Online Safety Tip of the Week

Top Tips for Parents of Under 5s

Did you know that 54% of pre-schoolers have their own device?

On average pre-schoolers are having more then 6+ hours of screen time a week. So, what can parents and carers do to ensure their child is protected from risk and has a healthy attitude when it comes to screen time?

<u>Top-Tips:</u>

 Explore together – talk to them about the Internet and what a great resource it can be while exploring websites and activities together

2) Be involved – make sure your child is in the same room as you while they are on devices, ask questions and check in on what they are viewing and doing regularly.

3) Put yourself in control – ensure you have parental controls set on devices your child has access to.

4) Use passwords – set these on all internet enabled devices you have, so you know when and where your child is accessing the internet.

5) Search safely – set restrictions on search engines like Google if your child searches independently
6) Use age appropriate sites and games – choose sites that are designed with children in mind

7) Set boundaries – it is not too early to set some rules about which games and apps children are allowed to go on and how long you will allow them to stay on them for.
