Little Stars

This information has now been updated to reflect the changes in government funding.

Little Stars Enrolment Information

- Little Stars is our nursery provision for two to three year olds.
- You can add your child's name to the Little Stars waiting list once they are one year old.
- Admissions criteria in the case of over subscription are on the school website.
- Places in Little Stars can be paid for privately or by using the government funding provided for childcare.
- We have two intake points for Little Stars, in September and January. All children can be admitted
 at the first intake point after their second birthday as long as a place is available. Children can be
 admitted in between intake points if a place is available, however children who turn two in the
 spring or summer term may have to wait for the September intake if no place is available before
 that.
