News and Reminders

Supporting Southwark

Members of our federation staff are often asked by Southwark to provide support to other local Schools. At Southwark's request, Sarah Beard is currently providing leadership support at Goodrich Primary School. This means that she will be spending three days a week at Goodrich for the rest of this term at least. She will still spend one day a week in both Bessemer and Keyworth and despite her reduced physical presence she remains very firmly in her post as our executive headteacher!

Key Stage Transitions

While all transitions in school are important for children, it is often the transitions from one Key Stage to the next which are the most significant, therefore we have put some actions in place to support with this.

Early Years to Key Stage One:

There is a transition meeting for parents and carers of children moving from Reception to Year 1 at 9.15am on 12th July. Please try to attend as there are a number of differences in routines, procedures and expectations in Key Stage One and this meeting will support you in understanding the changes and helping to prepare your children.

Key Stage One to Key Stage Two:

Please remember that as part of their transition to Year Three, children in Year Two should be dropped off in the Key Stage One playground, via the red gate from Monday. The playground will open at 8.50am and all children should be in the playground by the time the bell rings at 9am. Children in breakfast club will be taken to the playground by staff. For the first week parents and carers are welcome to come into the playground with children, after that we ask that you leave them at the gate to help them get used to the dropping off procedures in Key Stage Two.

We will send out further information about the transition to Year 3 later this term to allow you to discuss it with your child over the holidays.

Key Stage Two to Key Stage Three:

There is a flyer attached at the end of the newsletter offering support with the transition to secondary school. Please also try to attend any transition events offered by your child's secondary school.

If you or your child have any concerns about their transition to their next class, whether this involves changing Key Stage or not, please speak to your child's class teacher. Please also look back at the whole school newsletters from the end of last half term which listed suggested activities to do at home to ease any worries over transition.

Online Safety Tip of the Week

This week's tip of the week looks at how we can set a good example to our children by being a 'Digital Role Model'.

As parents and carers, we are the most significant adult in our child's life - and one of their biggest influences. How we interact with technology and the online world will impact on how they relate to the technology themselves.

We might have developed habits, like spending too long on our phone, responding to emails during time spent together, over sharing on social media, or being critical of the content they like to see online.

The key points they share are:

- Understanding children's online world by finding out about the apps, games and influencers they like to access online.
- Lead by example with limits and restrictions to your own internet use
- Asking permission before sharing images or posts about your child online
- Not being critical of the videos and activities they enjoy doing online as long as they are not harmful
- Talk to them about your own activity online this is a great way of encouraging dialogue about what they might
 be doing online too
