#### **Home Reading**

We have a very strong emphasis on reading at Bessemer as children who read regularly and enjoy a wide variety of books are more likely to be academically successful. Reading is also a great way to support children's wellbeing, as well as being a lot of fun! Some of the ways we support reading in school are:


- daily reading lessons in class
- daily 1:1 reading for children who are below expected levels in reading
- dedicated time for reading for pleasure in class
- investment in class reading areas
- book areas in all playgrounds
- local library visits
- pop up book shops and the lending library by the office
- KS1 book club
- Author visits
- Stickers and certificates for home reading

While other areas of home learning are encouraged, reading is the only area of home learning that we consider 'compulsory' in most year groups at Bessemer, because we think it is the most important thing that parents and carers can do to support children's learning. We expect every child to read at home daily, and while we understand that there will be occasional days that this is not possible we believe that all children should have at least 30 home reads in their diaries by now. We check reading diaries weekly to monitor home reading and next week we will be contacting the parents and carers of any child who has fewer than 30 home reads for this half term to see how we can support improvement in this area.

#### **School Council**

The children on the school council have been working on developing the provision in our playgrounds. They were provided with a budget and have carried out surveys in KS2 classes to find out what new equipment children would like to play with. They collated the results, producing graphs to show the most popular choices and will now be ordering the new equipment.





The Word of the Week next week is **sincere.** Please help your child to find out the meaning of the word and try using it in different ways in sentences. You could add a prefix or suffix to make a new word, e.g. **insincere** or **sincerely.** You could also research the origins of the word and see if you can think of any related words with the same origin.

Try to use the word of the week as much as possible so that it becomes part of your child's vocabulary. Children will receive gems in school for using the word in their speech and writing and for explaining its meaning and origin.

#### Online Safety Tip of the Week

#### <u>Top Social Networks for Older Children</u>

Social media has continued to grow in popularity with both teens and tweens. According to a BBC survey more than three quarters of younger children between 10 and 12 years old are using at least one social media network.

If your child is eager to start tweeting, posting or sharing but they are not old enough or ready to use the likes of Facebook or Instagram (which both have an age limit of 13+), then there are a number of alternative social networks made for children that you can point them towards. As well as offering child-friendly features like games and contests, these can also be used as a teaching tool by parents and carers, to get children sharing and engaging with friends they know in a safer environment. In school this month, each class is completing a project based on a range of people from black British history. In addition to this, we will be watching the 'Big Live Assembly' in school on Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> October.

As we as focusing on oracy and speaking skills at Bessemer, as a home learning task, we would like to we would like you prepare a speech on a significant person (or event) in British Black History. You can select anyone or a significant event but may want to take inspiration from the individuals below:



Your speech could include relevant information about your chosen individual such as:

Introduction: Their full name, age date of birth, occupation(s): do and did they have a family? Where do/did they live?

Main: What are they famous for? What have they famous for? What have achieved in their life? Have they hit any obstacles in life?

Conclusion: Why did you pick this person? Why are they significant within Black History? What have they achieved?

Google Classroom for all pupils will be up and running again later in October - This will be the best platform to submit your videos and speeches. However if you would like to present what you find out in a different way, such as a poster, poster-board, booklet or power-point, this will also be welcomed!
