There has been lots of creative and practical learning going on across the curriculum in Year 5 this week!

In English children made models of the bedroom of the main character in their class text *The London Eye Mystery* to support their descriptive writing.



As part of their new topic Anglo-Saxons Year 5 made models of an Anglo-Saxon village.

In science the Year 5s investigated the relationship between air resistance and surface area by making and testing different sized parachutes.

In computing the children practised different filming techniques, such as high and low shots, close ups, midrange and moving shots.







Finally, moving away from Year 5's exciting week, children in Year 1 carried out a maths investigation exploring place value with numbers up to 20. They took part in lots of creative and practical maths activities using manipulatives to show their understanding.







Word of the Week

Word of the Week is all about developing children's vocabularies by increasing the number of words they know and use. Making these challenging words part of their vocabulary improves children's speaking and listening, reading and writing skills.

The Word of the Week next week is **momentum.** Please help your child to find out the meaning of the word and try using it in different ways in sentences.

Try to use the word of the week as much as possible so that it becomes part of your child's vocabulary. Children will receive gems in school for using the word in their speech and writing and for explaining its meaning and origin.
