





## Safeguarding concerns

# The biggest safeguarding issue at Keyworth is children's use of online platforms <u>outside</u> of school.

In the past year, the school has been made aware of Keyworth children:

- > Engaging in or being witness to cussing, swearing and inappropriate language when online;
- > Engaging in or being witness to discriminatory language/images when online;
- > Being witness to inappropriate sexualised language/images when online;
- > Communicating with other users who are unknown to them when online.

In school, online safety is taught at the start of every Computing lesson and the children are able to say what they should do to keep themselves and others safe when online. However, when outside of school, they do not always apply their knowledge of this.

Please ensure that you reinforce messages delivered in school and regularly check what your child/ren is/are accessing when online. Please refer to the tips below and the online links to support you.

## Get familiar with regular conversations

- Start a conversation when your children will be more receptive and engaged, such as on the way to or from school
- Ask them for advice on how to do something online and use this as a conversation starter
- Make sure they know they can come to you if they're upset by something they've seen online
- Be sensitive and encourage them when they share their online experiences with you
- If your child talks about an issue with you, stay calm and listen without judging them

## Check they know the rules

- Don't share personal information like their phone number or email address online
- Only talk to real life friends or family if they are on sites with a social media element
- Explain that people they meet online might not be who they say they are
- Tell them to be a good online friend and not to say nasty things even if it's just a joke
- Use secure and legal sites to download music and games
- Make sure they check with you before downloading any programs to avoid viruses




## School walking map

### Year 6 - oracy


Year 6 developed their oracy skills by presenting their researched Windrush Generation PowerPoints to children in year 3.






<u>Year 2 - Black History Month</u> To celebrate Black History Month, the year 2 children learnt about Mary Seacole and her amazing work as a nurse during the Crimean War. They were inspired by her determination to help others despite being turned away because of the colour of her skin. They made artwork and posters, and then presented what they had learnt to the year 6s. In return, the year 6 children shared what they had learnt about the Windrush generation and presented informative PowerPoints which they had made in class.







<u>Year 4 - Science</u>
The children in year 4 have been learning about the digestive system. They replicated the process of digestion and made scientific observations along the way. They all were excited to find out that bread once broken down in the mouth can taste sweet and that our stomachs contain power acids to break down food further.









## Year 2 - Now Press Play


