

#### Attendance - figures by groups

Last week I shared the names of children who are currently meeting the whole school attendance target of 96%. By coming into school regularly, these children are being given the best opportunity to thrive academically, emotionally and socially. The table below shows the attendance percentage and number of children for each attendance percentage from Reception to Year 6 for this academic year to date:

There are currently 69 children in Reception to year 6 who are persistently absent from school, meaning they are persistently absent. While I appreciate that there have recently been several sickness bugs going around, to be persistently absent at this stage of the year a child would need to have already had at least two weeks off school.

#### Is my child too ill for school?

#### Is my child too ill for school?

Lots of Keyworth children have recently had chicken pox. Children can return to school once all spots have crusted over, which usually takes 5 days.

#### School uniform

I have noticed that more and more children are not wearing school uniform to school. While we are not overly strict on enforcing a full school uniform, it is really important for all children to come to school in their uniform ready to learn. I have asked teachers to communicate this directly with parents/carers should appropriate school uniform not be worn.



#### Parent/carer conduct - reminder

Keyworth has the highest expectations in relation to the conduct of children, staff and parents, with any inappropriate behaviour being challenged and actioned.

As a reminder, any concerns regarding incidents in school must be addressed through the proper channels with school staff and in a calm manner. Parents/carers should not be going up to other parents/carers as this antagonises others and makes the situation worse. This is not the type of school that Keyworth is or one that we want for the children to attend.

Our priority is to maintain a safe and respectful environment for all children, parents/carers and staff. Any disputes between parents/carers should be handled away from the school premises and any concerns about incidents involving children should be reported directly to the school for appropriate resolution.

If parents/carers are involved in disputes or confrontations in and around school, this may result in a ban from the school premises. We take this matter extremely seriously and expect all members of our school community to behave in a respectful and responsible way.

We appreciate your cooperation in ensuring that our school remains a positive and supportive community for everyone.

#### Vision screening for Reception children

Each year all Reception aged children are invited to have their eyes checked as part of the national vision screening programme. These checks help to ensure a child's eyesight is developing normally. Vision screening takes place at this age so any problems can be picked up early with Keyworth hosting a Reception vision screening session on Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> April. Reception parents/carers will receive full details in an email and can find further information below:

#### Why are eye tests important?

We want to let you know if your child sees well. Unfortunately, not all eye problems are obvious and only an eye test can spot them.

Age 4 or 5 is the perfect age to do this eye test as the children are old enough to get an accurate result and young enough to treat any problems effectively.

#### Who are the Eyelook team?

Orthoptic assistant: Specially trained to do vision tests on 4-5 year old children.

Orthoptists: Are experts who work in the clinic, they are experts at testing vision in children and treating eye problems like squint, lazy eye and the need for glasses.

Paediatric ophthalmologist: the children's eye doctor who works in the eye clinic and will check the health of the eye.

#### What happens during the school eye test?

The orthoptic assistant will check your child is seeing well using letters and a matching game. The test is fun to do and only takes a few minutes.

#### What do parents need to do before the test?

Keep these details safe so you know how to contact us. Please complete the slip below and return it to school if your child is already under care or you **DO NOT** want your child's vision tested.

#### What happens afterwards?

After the eye test, we will send a letter home with your child stating what we found and whether your child needs to be seen in our eye clinic. Clinic appointment letters will then be sent in the post.

#### What if my child is not at school that day?

If your child is absent on the day of testing we advise that you take them to your local high street optometrist for a routine sight test.

#### How often do children need their eyes tested?

It is advised that children have their eyes tested once between 4-5 years of age. Once we know your child can see well there is no need for regular eye checks. If you notice any change, if a child complains of a change to their vision, or other new problems we advise you take them to your local optician.
