



Attendance update

As you will know, a child's level of attendance to school directly impacts their academic performance, wellbeing and future successes - the better a child's attendance the better they will achieve in all areas.

Schools have a legal obligation to monitor children's attendance and we will be contacting families in the coming weeks where children have poor attendance to school (below 90% - at least 1-day absence every 2 weeks). This is the first stage of our attendance procedure and, should attendance not improve within a set period of time, the school will have to make referrals to Southwark/Lambeth Councils with a view to further action being taken.

Saying this, the majority of Keyworth have excellent attendance to school (above 96%) and we want to appreciate their efforts. Therefore, I am introducing a Keyworth attendance raffle...

Keyworth Attendance Raffle

- 1. All children will receive a raffle ticket should they attend school for a whole week from Monday to Friday. Every week they attend for a whole week is equivalent to 1 raffle ticket being received. This will be back-dated to the start of the academic year.
- 2. At the end of each half term, there will be a whole-school attendance raffle draw where 3 children will be selected as raffles winners. The greater your child's attendance, the greater their chance of doing well in school and the greater their chance of winning the attendance raffle...

One of our school values is **Progressive:** we can be the change we want to see around us. This week during assembly I posed the following question:


What is a woman's role in the family?


Keyworth Friends Wishlist


