#### Warmer weather

As we move into a period of warmer weather, please note the following:

- All children are encouraged to bring a labelled water bottle to school. There will be opportunities for children to drink and top-up their water bottle throughout the day;
- ➤ Children should wear appropriate clothing for the weather. Please ensure all clothing is labelled with your child/ren's name/s as they may choose to de-layer;
- Children can bring sunscreen to school but they will need to be able to apply it themselves - staff are not allowed to apply sunscreen to children. We encourage parents/carers to apply sunscreen prior to children coming to school;
- > Staff will reduce the level of physical activity and encourage shade, as necessary;
- > Sun hats are strongly encouraged;
- ➤ Children should have footwear that is appropriate for school and that is secure. Flip flops/sliders are not allowed for safety reasons;
- > Children can wear sunglasses when outside to protect their eyes. However, if partaking in sporting activities where this may be unsafe, then they should not wear them e.g. when playing football.

#### Windrush

Two of our school values are "respectful" and "progressive". Learning about the similarities and differences within our communities is really important in being respectful and progressive.

#### Respectful

We are respectful of each other's ideas, beliefs, backgrounds and practices.

We are considerate of the cultural identity and norms of the students and families we serve. Diversity, equality and inclusion are of great importance to us. 
During our assembly this week, we focused on migration and immigration, but specifically Windrush. Additionally, we discussed the theme of "our differences make us stronger".

It is 76 years since the HMT Empire Windrush docked in Tilbury, Essex, on 22 June 1948.

The ship brought 492 passengers to the UK from a number of Caribbean islands including

Jamaica and Trinidad and Tobago, to help fill post-war labour shortages. In 2018 it emerged that the government had not properly recorded the details of the people who had been granted permission to stay in the UK and many were wrongly deported.

The term refers to people who arrived in the UK from Caribbean countries between 1948 and 1971, when British immigration laws changed. Although





not all Windrush generation migrants arrived on HMT Empire Windrush itself, the ship became a symbol of the wider mass-migration movement.

Many of those who came to the UK had served in the British armed forces in World War Two. They became manual workers, cleaners, drivers and nurses in the newly established NHS - and some broke new ground in representing black Britons in society.

#### Word of the Week


