





Latest News

Attendance

As you know, attendance is a priority at Keyworth. This week

some parents/carers would have received a letter as follows:

Letter 1	Your child is in years 1 to 6 and has attendance below 90% this academic year (persistently absent). This is stage 1 of our attendance procedure and means that the school will be closely monitoring your child's attendance between now and the end of Spring term 1. Should attendance not improve, a formal meeting with the school will be made.
Letter 2	Your child is in years 1 to 6 and has attendance just above 90% this academic year, meaning that they are close to being persistently absent from school. This is a letter of notification to parents/carers to ensure that their child does not become persistently absent moving forward.
Letter 3	Your child is in Reception and has attendance below 90% this academic year (persistently absent). This is a letter of notification that attendance needs to improve moving forward as when children are 5 years old they are of compulsory school age. This will mean that your child will be monitored as part of the whole school attendance procedures.

If you did not receive a letter, none of the above applies to you.

Congratulations to the 93% of children (Reception to year 6) who attended school every day this week and received their attendance raffle ticket!
