☆ ☆ Moving forward the children will be streamed into three phonics classes rather than two. The new phonics class will be taught by Miss Speak.

Miss Speak's class will be practising phase 4 sounds. Phase 4 sounds are consonant clusters such as "fr" in "frog and "pt" in "kept". We do not teach these as new sounds and we encourage children to continue saying each sound individually (eg f-r-o-g).

Mr Mellett's phonics class and Miss Howard's will recapping phase 3 sounds.

If you have any questions regarding the new phonics groups speak to your child's teacher.

<u>A note about lateness</u>

Unfortunately, the level of lateness has crept back up. To clarify, the gates are opened at **8.55am and closed at 9.05am**. Your child should be brought to school at 8.55 so that they are in the classroom by 9am and you can leave the playground again before the gates are closed at 9.05. Being late not only affects your child but is also incredibly disruptive for others as it means teaching staff have to waste valuable teaching time letting in late children. Unless there are exonerating circumstances, we expect to see your child in on time teach day.
