Topic

This term our topic will be 'Under the Sea.' We will be looking at different aspects of the ocean including sea creatures- their features, what they eat, their habitats and how they protect themselves. We will also be looking at healthy and unhealthy environments and how we can better look after these.

Reading

Well done to everyone who is reading with their child every night. This is vital for their development and this will also help them with their writing. Maths

This term we are learning about the composition of 6,7 and 8. We will be continuing to add two groups of objects together to find the total, and attempt to write number sentences to match. We will be exploring height, length and time. In the second half of the term, we will be learning about the composition of 9 and 10 and will continue to explore partitioning, using the part- whole model.

PE will be on a **Wednesday.** Please bring your child to school wearing their PE kit and place their school clothes into their bag for them to get changed into after. Please ensure all of their school items including their uniform and their PE kit are named. We will not be able to find missing items if they are not named.
