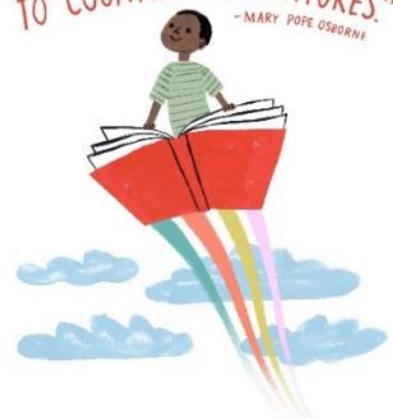
Reading

It is very important for children to practise reading every day. Through reading children are able to access the world around them and supports the development in all other areas. It is also important to foster a love for reading and we ask that you read a variety of stories to them that they enjoy. If you have any spare time we would love for you to take your child to the library where they can explore lots of different reading materials and stories.

You will have received your reading book and diary, it is expected that children bring both their reading diary and reading book into class every day. They will need to get these out of their bags and place them into a reading box. Your child's reading diary should be signed every time your child is reading at home this should be every day to best benefit your child. This could be a book, magazine, a newspaper of their choice or their reader from school. We are going to be giving out rewards for every five reads they do at home. This can only be monitored if the reading diary is being signed and is coming to school every day.

We will read every day with a group of children and if your child forgets their book it may mean that they miss out on reading with an adult that day. When your child is read to a comment will be left inside their reading diary, this will explain how your child is getting on and whether or not they are ready for a new book. We will not be giving your child a new book until they are ready for one so this may mean that your child has the book for a few weeks or it might mean that they get to change their book every time they are read to. If you are unsure please do not hesitate to ask we are always here to help.

Topic

Our topic this term is 'Explorers' where we will be learning about our place in the world. We will learn about our local area, our city, the UK, the continents and key explorers in history.

The focus of our topic this half term will be a combination of History and Geography. We will gain an understanding of where we are within the world, locating ourselves within various contexts. In our classrooms we will be creating our own world map to help our understanding. We will also be using the story *Naughty Bus* to draw our own simple maps. Later in the term, we will be using the story *Astro Girl* to support our learning about Mae Jemison's achievements.

This term we will be designing our own boat taking inspiration from Edward Smith and John Taylor. We will be using the knowledge gained from our science topic to help us design a boat that can float on water. Keep an eye out on the website for updates!

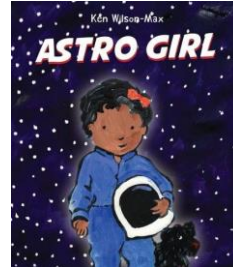
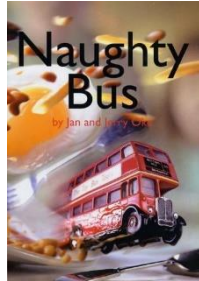


Maths

To follow on from last term's learning on addition within 10, we will be covering subtraction for numbers within 10. We will be using various methods such as counting backwards on a number line and crossing out. Following this, we will be solidifying our place value knowledge on numbers up to 20. To help your children at home with our maths this term, you could try counting backwards from 10 or 20, spotting numbers on your walk to school, practising number formation from 0-20, or counting objects around the home. You should have received your login for Mathletics last term, if you need support accessing this, please let us know as this program supports the learning we do in school.

English

This term we will be reading *Naughty Bus* and *Astro Girl*. Next term we will be reading fairy tales so please try to read some at home with your child(ren) so that they are familiar with these.



P.E
