Key Facts:

- Great Britain is an island, surrounded by the sea.
- Northern Ireland also has a large coastline.
- Human features found at the seaside might include a lighthouse, the promenade, the pier and the fairground.
- Physical features found at the seaside might include the beach, sea, cliffs and caves.
- Many tourists like to go to the seaside for their holidays.
- Seaside resorts often have a lot of attractions for tourists. They also have plenty of restaurants and cafes for people to visit.
- When people started travelling by train during the Victorian era, people started visiting the seaside for their holidays.
- Seaside resorts have changed a lot over time.
- Harbours are where boats are kept.
- Fishing is often an important industry in seaside towns.
