
Key Facts:

- Japan is an archipelagic country located in East Asia.
- Japan is made up of five main islands (<u>Hokkaido</u>, <u>Honshu</u> - the mainland - <u>Shikoku</u>, <u>Kyushu</u>, and <u>Okinawa</u>) and thousands of smaller ones.
- British Isles (UK)- like Japan is a cluster of islands.
- The British Isles consist mainly of flat or lowlands that phase NW into more hilly country. Due to this topography, humans have been able to settle throughout.
- Japan is about 20% lowland.
- Japan has over 125 million inhabitants and is densely populated into the available lowlands.
- Japan's terrain is mostly rugged and mountainous (73%).
- Japan's highest mountain is Mount Fuji -3,776 m (12,388 ft).
- Japan is located in the northwestern <u>Ring of Fire</u> on multiple <u>tectonic</u> <u>plates</u>
- Japan is prone to earthquakes, tsunami and volcanoes because of its location along the Pacific Ring of Fire.
- As many as 1,500 earthquakes are recorded yearly.
- Japan's physical geography impacts where people live, land use, farming, the development of its society and culture.
- Japan has also suffered a number of manmade disasters, e.g., Fukushima (a nuclear plant) nuclear disaster,
 Hiroshima and Nagasaki (atomic bombings in WW2) that have impacted both the physical and human geography

Key Vocabulary and Glossary:

Human Geography	Human geography is about how people move and live, e.g., buildings, roads, cities, structures.
Physical Geography	Physical geography is the study of Earth's natural features, e.g., oceans, forests, deserts, rivers, etc.
Archipelago	An archipelago is an area that contains a group of islands.
Tectonic Plates	Gigantic pieces of the Earth's crust broken up into large plates across the Earth.
Ring of Fire	A chain of volcanoes that surrounds the Pacific Ocean.
Tsunami	A large wave caused by movements of the Earth's outer layer.
Nuclear Power	A very powerful type of energy that can be used to create electricity for households or build bombs.

Key Questions:

- What is the Ring of Fire?
- How do earthquakes and volcanic eruptions take place?
- How has living with earthquakes and volcanic eruptions affected people's lives?
- Are there any benefits to living near a volcano?
- Which have had a worse effect on the natural environment, natural or man-made disasters?




